International pastors in Denmark wanted to keep this tradition of praying for the nation on that day. Thus, Prayer for the Nation (PFN) was founded in 2003 in Copenhagen.

This is a cross-denomination, cross-cultural initiative where we gather to pray and bless Denmark. It is the planning committee's hope that similar arrangements will happen across the country.
